<p>The overall objective of this project was to support a proper understanding and application of the new Moroccan Family Code by the legal professionals and the general public.</p> <p>The specific objectives were to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Develop training materials for court clerks on problematic issues of the execution of court decisions in the field of family law, ethics and court management. The materials will be enriched by including international standards and best practices in other countries; - Train Moroccan trainers of clerks in aforementioned topics and in methodology and didactics of training adults; - Increase awareness of Moroccan judges of the international human rights principles underlying the provisions of the new Code and enhance the exchange of idea's and expertise between them and their Dutch colleagues on certain topics of family law in both countries; - Develop training materials for young lawyers on gender equality and international human rights and their upholding before Moroccan courts, the execution of foreign court decisions in the field of family law in Morocco and selected problematic issues related to the application of the new Family Code; - Train trainers of young lawyers in aforementioned topics; - Monitor the performance of 4 remote courts in the field of family law and report about issues that need more attention in terms of a progressive application of the law and the execution of court decisions; - Organize yearly conferences to draw attention to and deal with the identified problematic issues, based on the monitoring reports of the 4 remote courts; - Better inform girls at secondary schools, in the same rural and remote regions related to the courts that will be monitored, about the new family law and their rights being on the verge of 18 years i.e. the age of marriage allowed for by the new law. 						<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Training of trainers; • Development training materials; • Awareness raising and training; • Publication of materials.
