Detailed description of project						Type and scope of services provided		
<p>This 36-month project addressed the requests of the Governments of the countries in the Western Balkans to support these countries in the reform of their legal systems and more particularly to ensure a more efficient and effective functioning of their systems in the area of enforcement law at the national and regional level. The overall aim was a more efficient and effective functioning of enforcement law in civil and commercial cases. This was addressed by strengthening the national systems of enforcement law, and by improving regional cooperation. The project supported all the countries in the Western Balkans.</p> <p>The specific objectives of the project were to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop proposals for revised or new legislative frameworks; • Train legal professionals entrusted with enforcement; • Provide (joint) trainings for judicial officers in the judicial training institutions and judicial training centres of all countries in the Western Balkans (<i>inter alia</i> the Judicial and Prosecutorial Training Centre of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina, and the Judicial and Prosecutorial Training Centre of Republika Srpska; • Develop appropriate mechanisms for monitoring and control; • Establish professional organizations and the organization of public awareness campaigns; • Strengthen regional cooperation in enforcement law by organizing (joint) regional trainings, the development of regional manuals with standards and best practices in the area of quality management, transparency of assets, and international regulations in the area of enforcement law; • Establish a regional organization for professionals entrusted with enforcement law, ultimately to be integrated into the UIHJ. 						<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legislative and policy advice; • Development of training needs assessment, training strategy and materials; • Organizational advice; • Training of professionals entrusted with enforcement and the supervision over enforcement; • Training of Judicial Officers via Judicial Training Institutions; • Development of a regional website; • Development of IT systems; • Study visits; • Development of manuals with standards and recommendations; • Development and implementation of awareness campaigns. <p>CILC provided a Key expert in Legal Advice, Capacity building and Training (370 working days), Project director (296 working days), Project assistant (189 working days) and Financial administrator (118 working days). CILC also provided a pool of 20 international experts (141 working days) and local experts (457 working days) in above mentioned fields. Regional coordination was provided by GIZ offices for 960 working days.</p>
