Detailed description of project

Overall objective:

Increased security and rule of law in Indonesia through combating transnational crime and terrorism. The project has been established as a result of a call from Jakarta Centre for Law Enforcement Cooperation (JCLEC) and the Indonesian National Police training centres for Intelligence and Investigation - PUSDIK Intel and Pusdik Reskrim respectively. The aim is to improve their capacity to train Indonesian police in Transnational crimes thereby contributing to an increase of manpower specialised to handle security challenges in the country.

The project main results are as follows:

- An accredited gender sensitive national curriculum on transnational crime prevention, investigation and intelligence, reflecting on international standards and best practices;
- An educational structure for the delivery of the national curriculum at JCLEC and the 2 PUSDIKs through blended learning and KERIS system, including well trained national trainers, a well set-up organisation, a QA system and adequate infrastructure;
- A dissemination strategy to spread the national curriculum to regional INP training centres.

In order to realise the aforementioned results the consortium will mobilise various international and national expertise to implement project activities in the course of 4 years duration of the project. This includes the development of strategies and policies during the first years to ensure proper embedment of the curriculum in the INP training system. Accordingly, substantial investments will be made to collaborate with the Education and Training Institute of the INP (Lemdikpol) in order to acquire guidelines on curriculum development and accreditation by the INP.

The project officially started on 1st December 2014 with a consortium meeting held on 10th December 2014. In the meeting that was attended by representatives from CILC consortium and Nuffic, parties discussed the steps necessary to prepare for a successful implementation of the project. A kick off of the project took place between 19th -23rd January in Indonesia.
