| <p>The main purpose of the Tailor Made training was to equip the officials of the Commission for Human Rights and Good Governance (CHRAGG) with knowledge on human rights and principles of good governance. In addition, the training was meant to provide practical skills on conducting investigation and writing investigative reports.</p> <p>The training addressed the main problems facing the Commission, namely:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Lack of legal background and sufficient knowledge on human rights and good governance by some investigation officers</li> <li>- Lack of investigation and investigation report writing skills</li> <li>- Frequent delays in handling of complaints</li> <li>- Low public trust</li> </ul> <p>Two European and one regional expert were engaged in this training, each one of them with a different dimension.</p> <p>The impact of the TMT is that the Commission has gained competent staff to carry out its work in fulfilling its core function of receiving, filing and investigating complaints related to violation of human rights and contravention of principles of good governance. This will eventually lead to improved service delivery by the Commission and stimulate knowledge and experience sharing amongst staff and other legal professionals. It will also help to improve professionalism and efficiency in handling of human rights cases.</p> <p>With the developed training manual and other useful materials we are assured that the training results will be sustainable.
