<p><b>Overall objective:</b> To contribute to the advancement of human rights and fundamental freedoms as part of the EU's action on the international scene, in accordance to article 21 Treaty of European Union (TEU).</p> <p>The specific objective of the project are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To prepare a study accompanied by relevant assessment tools and guidelines that will provide operational guidance on how to incorporate human rights safeguards in the design and implementation of security-related actions.</li> <li>To provide the necessary expertise and assistance to the EU decision makers on EU engagement in security and justice assistance in third countries on how to apply the recommended tools in different projects especially related to counter-terrorism, fight against organised crimes and protection of critical infrastructure.</li> <li>To organise a validation workshop in which the draft study and tools will be presented to the EU delegation and relevant stakeholders to incite input.</li> <li>To organise a training seminar upon completion of the study and its approval by the Contracting Authority.</li> </ul> <p>The project start was delayed for three weeks due to Christmas holidays and difficulties in mobilising the team in time. It was launched by a kick off on 8<sup>th</sup> January 2015 during which the expected outputs and timeframes were re-instated. Given the late start the delivery of the milestones will be delayed by one month. Following the kick off, an inception period of two weeks was agreed.
