The purpose of the contract is to provide mainly DG HOME but also the other Commission services as well as European Police College (CEPOL), European Agency for the operational management of large-scale IT systems in the area of freedom, security and justice (eu-LISA), European Asylum Support Office (EASO), European Agency for the Management of Operational Cooperation at the External Borders of the Member States of the European Union (Frontex) and European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction (EMCDDA) with timely evidence-based services of an intellectual nature to support its impact assessment, evaluation and evaluation related activities.</p> <p>The contract covers impact assessment, evaluation and evaluation related services to be carried out in the Migration and Home Affairs area, which includes the following policies (non-exhaustive list):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Legal immigration and integration of third country nationals; - Irregular migration and return; - Asylum; - Visa; - Management of the EU external borders; - Large-scale IT systems (SIS, VIS, etc.); - Crisis management and fight against terrorism; - Fight against crime; - Trafficking in human beings; - Police cooperation and access to information; - Anti-Drugs policies; - Research, innovation and industry for security aspects; - International aspects of the above-mentioned policies, such as: 				<p>Impact assessments, evaluations and other evaluation related services are the assignments that fall under the scope of the contract.</p> <p>The specific assignments may require the performance of the following tasks (non-exhaustive list):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To construct and/or reconstruct the logic of interventions; - To define appropriate evaluation criteria; - To collect quantitative and qualitative information through: desk research, surveys, individual interviews, focus groups, workshops, experts groups, case studies, etc.; - To use specific evaluation tools and methodological approaches, such as: statistical analysis, economic analysis, needs assessment, cost-benefit analysis, cost-effectiveness analysis, regression analysis, benchmarking, risk assessment, sensitivity analysis, multi-criteria analysis, etc.; - To build and implement valid analytical and interpretative models, including economic models; - To develop and analyse legal arguments; - To measure and quantify (also in monetary terms) results and impacts, both retrospectively and prospectively; - To judge objectively impacts and results; - To develop and monitor appropriate indicators; - To support the contracting authority in fine-tuning and improving policy objectives (SMART objectives); - To help the contracting authority in formulating realistic policy options; - To assess and quantify the administrative burden of policy options.
