<p>The overall objective of this project is to support the development of the rule of the law and good governance in Libya. The project will operate within a Government-to-Government (G2G) framework between the Dutch government and Libyan government.</p> <p>The specific objective is to support the HJI of Libya in developing the capacities of the teaching staff to develop curriculum and teaching methods, using case studies from new legal fields such as financial crime, organised crime and human trafficking.</p>				<p>The methodology of the training programme is characterised by cooperation between the HJI and the CILC team of experts to support HJI in the development of its teaching capacities in these new and important crime topics and including legislative drafting.
