Detailed description of project				Type and scope of services provided				
<p>The overall objective of this project is to support the development of the rule of the law and good governance in Libya. The project will operate within a Government-to-Government (G2G) framework with the purpose to ultimately strengthen relations between the Dutch government and the Libyan government.</p> <p>The specific objective is to support the High Judicial Institute (HJI) of Libya in developing the capacities of their trainers to draft fit-for-purpose legal curricula documents and programmes for the HJI's training courses. By its design and set-up of the online training program, the project will also develop the capacities of these trainers to execute the curricula.</p> <p>This project (basically a training programme) therefore aims to achieve the following result: equip 14 key personnel members within the HJI with the skills and knowledge to draft fit-for purpose legal curricula documents and programmes for the HJI's training courses.</p>				<p>Two 5-day online trainings are conducted, one for trainers of the HJI's Initial Legal Education Programme and other for trainers of the HJI's Continuing Professional Development Programme. Each training event foresees that one of the training days is dedicated to Human Trafficking Practitioners from the Dutch Public Prosecution Office; accordingly the Curricula Development Trainer is teaching for 4 days out of the 5 day course.</p> <p>Both trainings will contain an emphasis on the promotion and inclusion of critical legal thinking skills, practical examples, and experiential learning within the two curricula areas. There will also be an emphasis on human rights and gender balance in the drafting of curricula.</p> <p>Output of the training sessions are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 14 trainers of the HJI trained; - 1 curricula framework on the topic of Human Trafficking for the Initial Legal Education Programme; developed by the participants with support of the Curricula Development Trainer - 1 curricula framework on the topic of Human Trafficking for the Continuing Professional Development Programme; developed by the participants with support of the Curricula Development Trainer - Enhanced teaching skills of the participants regarding the execution of new curricula - Enhanced networking and the exchange of expertise and information between the participants. <p>CILC provides 3 experts:</p> <p>CILC staff for this project consists of: Adriana Thomson</p>
