<p>The right to a fair, timely and efficient trial by an independent, professional, and predictable court is a prerequisite for the rule of law. The overall objective of this project is to establish a more effective and efficient administration of justice in Ukraine. Facilitating cooperation between Ukrainian and Dutch judges, this Ukrainian-Dutch project works towards its overall objective by strengthening the self-government and professionalism of judges, improving court procedures, and enhancing the quality of court decisions.</p> <p>The related long-term objective is increased public trust of Ukrainian citizens in a strengthened independent, impartial, transparent, and predictable judiciary.</p> <p>The objectives of the project are realised through a variety of activities, including assessment sessions, trainings, roundtables, workshops and peer coaching.</p> <p>The project can engage in a cooperation with up to 7 target courts in the Kyiv and Vinnitsa regions.
